### Requirements:

- Youth enrolled in a 4-H, FFA, or other youth groups in a supervised fruit and/or vegetable project are eligible to participate in this project.
- All produce exhibited must be from the current year's crop and from the exhibitor's own garden.
- Vegetable exhibitors are limited to listing no more than 10 vegetables on the fair entry form plus a vegetable box.
- Refer to UW Extension Publication A3306, Exhibiting and Judging Vegetables for guidelines on how to clean and trim vegetables for exhibit.
- Fruits and vegetables need to be cleaned but not washed. Dirty or spoiled produce will be disqualified.
- Garden Boxes: Exhibits must include the number of specimens per type according to the following list:

- Potatoes:
  - Turn in a 3X5 inch card with the variety name with the exhibit
  - Clean potatoes with soft brush or cloth--washing is not recommended.
- Fruit and vegetable exhibits may be removed after 8:00 p.m. on Sunday.

26. Cucumbers, sweet pickle size-1½-2½" w/stem ¼-½" (6)
27. Cucumbers, dill pickles - 3"- 4" w/stem ¼-½" (6)
28. Cucumbers, slicing - 6"- 8" w/stem ¼-½" (3)
29. Dill, 3 stems-trim stem 3" below the spot where umbels connect, tied
30. Eggplant - trim stem to 1" - (1)
31. Endive, one plant, roots off, wrapped in moist towel
32. Herbs, in 6" pot, single or combine plant (Label)
33. Herbs, dried or fresh
34. Kohlrabi, 1" tops - (3)
35. Lettuce - 1 head
36. Muskmelon - (1)
37. Onions, yellow, (Not peeled) 1" tops - (4)
