Department Regulations:

1. Wildflowers may not be used in bouquet or arrangements. Wild greens may be used.
2. This department is open to amateurs only. Exhibitor must create his or her own arrangement.
3. Cut flower exhibits are to be 3 stems or blooms unless specified. They are to be exhibited in a narrow necked, clear class container.
4. Houseplant exhibits must include a 3 X 5 inch card labeled with the name of plant and date started.
5. All plants and plant products must be the property of the exhibitor and the result of the exhibitor's own efforts.
6. No extra greens; only greens from flower being displayed
